¹² Now **if** Christ is preached that He has been raised from the dead, how do some among you say that there is no resurrection of the dead?

¹³ But **if** there is no resurrection of the dead, **then** Christ is not risen.

¹⁴ And **if** Christ is not risen, **then** our preaching *is* empty and your faith *is* also empty.

¹⁵ Yes, **and** we are found false witnesses of God, because we have testified of God that He raised up Christ, whom He did not raise up—**if** in fact the dead do not rise.

The belief of no resurrection... (for anyone): If there is no resurrection...

- Christ is not risen
- Our preaching is empty

- We are false witnesses

¹⁶ For **if** *the* dead do not rise, **then** Christ is not risen.

¹⁷ And **if** Christ is not risen, your faith *is* futile; you are still in your sins!

¹⁸ **Then** also those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished.

¹⁹ If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men the most pitiable.

If [the] dead do not rise...

- Christ is not risen
- Our belief is futile
- We are still in our sins
- All believers who have died are dead
- We are the world's most pitiable people

7. The Truth: Christ ______ Risen from the Dead

²⁰ But now Christ is risen from the dead, *and* has become the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹ For since by man *came* death, by Man also *came* the resurrection of the dead. ²² For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive.

- Jesus HAS BEEN RISEN
- Jesus is the firstfruits of those who died
- Death came by man (Adam)
- Resurrection came by Man (Jesus)
- Through Adam all die
- Through Jesus all shall be made alive

²³ But each one in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, **afterward** those *who are* Christ's at His coming. ²⁴ **Then** *comes* the end, when He delivers the kingdom to God the Father, **when** He puts an end to all rule and all authority and power. ²⁵ For He must reign **till** He has put all enemies under His feet. ²⁶ The last enemy *that* will be destroyed *is* death. ²⁷ For "He has put all things under His feet." But when He says "all things are put under *Him," it is* evident that He who put all things under Him is excepted. ²⁸ Now **when** all things are made subject to Him, **then** the Son Himself will also be subject to Him who put all things under Him, that God may be all in all.

Then last of all He was seen by me also, as by one born out of due time. For I am the least of the apostles, who am not worthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God.
