### Lordship Salvation #8: The Interpretation of Romans 10:9-10

# The context must be understood before **any** passage can be interpreted.

#### PRINCIPLE: Clear texts take precedent over unclear texts.

<sup>9</sup> that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. <sup>10</sup> For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

#### Context of Romans 10:9-10: What does the BIBLE say?

- People attempt to connect these verses to **eternal salvation**.
- The Bible has many **better** passages that clearly teach salvation.

### Context of Romans 10:9-10: What is the structure of ROMANS?

- Condemnation: The Need for the Righteousness of God (1-3:20)
- Salvation: God Provides His Righteousness (3:21-5:21)
- Sanctification: God Applies Righteousness to Living (6-8)
- Vindication: God's Righteousness and Israel (9-11)
- Application: God's Righteousness for Service (12-16)

# **POSSIBLE INTERPRETATIONS:**

- Confess may equal believe the way it is used.
- Salvation may have a different meaning.
- Some other explanation that does not conflict with clear passages.

# Romans 10:1-11 – The Immediate Context of Romans 10:9-10

<sup>1</sup>Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is that they may be **SAVED**.

 $^{\rm 2}$  For I bear them witness that they have a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge.

<sup>3</sup> For they being ignorant of God's **righteousness**, and seeking to establish their own **righteousness**, have not submitted to the **righteousness** of God.

<sup>4</sup> For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes.

<sup>5</sup> For Moses writes about the **righteousness** which is of the **law**, "The man who **does** those things shall live by them."

<sup>6</sup> But the **righteousness** of faith speaks in this way, "Do not say in your **heart**, `Who will ascend into heaven?"" (that is, to bring Christ down *from above*) <sup>7</sup> or, "`Who will descend into the abyss?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead).

<sup>8</sup> But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your **mouth** and in your **heart** " (that is, the word of faith which we preach): <sup>9</sup> that if you confess with your **mouth** the Lord Jesus and believe in your **heart** that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be **SAVED**. <sup>10</sup> For with the **heart** one believes unto **righteousness**, and with the **mouth** confession is made unto **SALVATION**. <sup>11</sup> For the Scripture says, "Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame."

#### Deuteronomy 30:11-20 - The Passage Quoted in Romans 10

<sup>11</sup> "For this commandment which I command you today *is* not *too* mysterious for you, nor *is* it far off. <sup>12</sup> "It *is* not in heaven, that you should say, `Who will ascend into heaven for us and bring it to us, that we may hear it and **do** it?' <sup>13</sup> "Nor *is* it beyond the sea, that you should say, `Who will go over the sea for us and bring it to us, that we may hear it and **do** it?' <sup>14</sup> "But the word *is* very near you, in your mouth and in your **heart**, that you may **do** it.

<sup>15</sup> "See, I have set before you today life and good, death and evil, <sup>16</sup> "in that I command you today to love the LORD your God, to walk in His ways, and to keep His commandments, His statutes, and His judgments, <u>that</u> you may **live** and **multiply**; and the LORD your God will **bless** you in the land which you go to possess.

<sup>17</sup> "But if your **heart** turns away so that you do not hear, and are **drawn away**, and **worship** other gods and serve them, <sup>18</sup> "I announce to you today <u>that</u> you shall surely perish; you shall not prolong *your* days in the land which you cross over the Jordan to go in and possess.

<sup>19</sup> "I call heaven and earth as witnesses today against you, *that* I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing; therefore choose life, <u>that</u> both you and your descendants may live; <sup>20</sup> "that you may **ove** the LORD your God, that you may **obey** His voice, and <u>that</u> you may **cling** to Him, for He *is* your life and the length of your days; and <u>that</u> you may **dwell** in the land which the LORD swore to your fathers, to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, to give them."

όμολογέω (homologeo) – to promise, agree, confess (26x in 23 verses)

Matt. 7:23 "And then I will declare to them, `I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!"

<u>Matt. 10:32</u> "Therefore whoever <u>confesses</u> Me before men, him I will also <u>confess</u> before My Father who is in heaven.

Matt. 14:7 Therefore he promised with an oath to give her whatever she might ask.

<u>Lk. 12:8</u> "Also I say to you, whoever <u>confesses</u> Me before men, him the Son of Man also will <u>confess</u> before the angels of God.

Jn. 1:20 He confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, "I am not the Christ."

<u>Jn. 9:22</u> His parents said these *things* because they feared the Jews, for the Jews had agreed already that if anyone <u>confessed</u> *that* He *was* Christ, he would be put out of the synagogue.

<u>Jn. 12:42</u> Nevertheless even among the rulers many believed in Him, but because of the Pharisees they did not <u>confess</u> *Him*, lest they should be put out of the synagogue;

Acts 7:17 "But when the time of the promise drew near which God had sworn to Abraham, the people grew and multiplied in Egypt

Acts 23:8 For Sadducees say that there is no resurrection-- and no angel or spirit; but the Pharisees confess both.

Acts 24:14 "But this I confess to you, that according to the Way which they call a sect, so I worship the God of my fathers, believing all things which are written in the Law and in the Prophets.

Rom. 10:9 that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.

Rom. 10:10 For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

<u>1 Tim. 6:12</u> Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, to which you were also called and have confessed the good confession in the presence of many witnesses.

Titus 1:16 They profess to know God, but in works they deny *Him*, being abominable, disobedient, and disqualified for every good work.

Heb. 11:13 These all died in faith, not having received the promises, but having seen them afar off were assured of them, embraced *them* and <u>confessed</u> that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth.

Heb. 13:15 Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of *our* lips, giving thanks to His name.

1 Jn. 1:9 If we **confess** our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

<u>1 Jn. 2:23</u> Whoever denies the Son does not have the Father either; he who acknowledges the Son has the Father also.

**<u>1</u> Jn. 4:2** By this you know the Spirit of God: Every spirit that <u>confesses</u> that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is of God,

<u>1 Jn. 4:3</u> and every spirit that <u>does</u> not <u>confess</u> that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is not of God. And this is the *spirit* of the Antichrist, which you have heard was coming, and is now already in the world.

<u>**1** Jn. 4:15</u> Whoever <u>confesses</u> that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God.

<u>**2** Jn. 1:7</u> For many deceivers have gone out into the world who do not confess Jesus Christ *as* coming in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist.

Rev. 3:5 "He who overcomes shall be clothed in white garments, and I will not blot out his name from the Book of Life; but I will confess his name before My Father and before His angels.

# δμολογία (homologia) – confession (6x in 6 verses)

2 Cor 9:13 while, through the proof of this ministry, they glorify God for the obedience of your confession to the gospel of Christ, and for *your* liberal sharing with them and all *men*,

1 Tim 6:12 Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, to which you were also called and have confessed the good <u>confession</u> in the presence of many witnesses.

1 Tim 6:13 I urge you in the sight of God who gives life to all things, and *before* Christ Jesus who witnessed the good <u>confession</u> before Pontius Pilate,

Heb 3:1 Therefore, holy brethren, partakers of the heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our confession, Christ Jesus,

Heb 4:14 Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast *our* <u>confession</u>.

Heb 10:23 Let us hold fast the <u>confession</u> of *our* hope without wavering, for He who promised *is* faithful.
