b. By Asking from God What We Need to Honor and Serve Him

Jn. 16:24 "Until now you have asked nothing in My name. Ask, and you will receive, that your **joy** may be full.

c. By Believing What God Has Revealed

Rom. 15:13 Now \underline{may} the God of hope \underline{fill} you with all \underline{joy} and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

1 Pet. 1:8 whom <u>having</u> not seen you love. Though now you do not see *Him*, yet believing, you rejoice with **joy** inexpressible and full of glory,

d. By Being Unified in God's Defined Direction

Phil. 2:2 <u>fulfill</u> my **joy** by being like-minded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind.

2 Tim. 1:4-5 greatly desiring to see you, being mindful of your tears, that <u>I may be filled</u> with **joy**, ⁵ when I call to remembrance the genuine faith that is in you, which dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am persuaded is in you also.

e. By Seeing God's Work Impact the Word

Acts 13:49-52 And the word of the Lord was being spread throughout all the region. ⁵⁰ But the Jews stirred up the devout and prominent women and the chief men of the city, raised up persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their region. ⁵¹ But they shook off the dust from their feet against them, and came to Iconium. ⁵² And the disciples were <u>filled</u> with **joy** and with the Holy Spirit.

Takeaways

Jn. 3:29 "He who has the bride is the bridegroom; but the friend of the bridegroom, who stands and hears him, rejoices greatly ["with joy rejoices"] because of the bridegroom's voice. Therefore this joy of mine is fulfilled. [John the Baptist]

c. Joy Promised at Jesus' Birth

Lk. 2:10 Then the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great **joy** which will be to all people.

d. Joy at Salvation

Matt. 13:20 "But he who received the seed on stony places, this is he who hears the word and immediately receives it with **joy**;

Mk. 4:16 "These likewise are the ones sown on stony ground who, when they hear the word, immediately receive it with **gladness**;

Lk. 8:13 "But the ones on the rock *are those* who, when they hear, receive the word with **joy**; and these have no root, who believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away.

e. Joy in the Resurrection

Matt. 28:8 So they went out quickly from the tomb with fear and great **joy**, and ran to bring His disciples word.

Lk. 24:41 But while they still did not believe for **joy**, and marveled, He said to them, "Have you any food here?"

Jn. 16:20-22 "Most assuredly, I say to you that you will weep and lament, but the world <u>will rejoice</u>; and you will be sorrowful, but your sorrow will be turned into **joy**. ²¹ "A woman, when she is in labor, has sorrow because her hour has come; but as soon as she has given birth to the child, she no longer remembers the anguish, for **joy** that a human being has been born into the world. ²² "Therefore you now have sorrow; but I will see you again and your heart <u>will rejoice</u>, and your **joy** no one will take from you.

f. Joy at the Ascension

Lk. 24:52 And they worshiped Him, and returned to Jerusalem with great **joy**,

g. Joy in the Midst of Tribulation

2 Cor. 7:4 Great *is* my boldness of speech toward you, great *is* my boasting on your behalf. I am filled with comfort. I am exceedingly **joyful** [in the joy] in all our tribulation.

2 Cor. 8:2 that in a great trial of affliction the <u>abundance</u> of their **joy** and their deep poverty abounded in the riches of their liberality.

Jas. 1:2 My brethren, count it all **joy** when you fall into various trials, Heb. 10:34 for you had compassion on me in my chains, and **joyfully** [with joy] accepted the plundering of your goods, knowing that you have a better and an enduring possession for yourselves in heaven.

Col. 1:11 strengthened with all might, according to His glorious power, for all patience and longsuffering with **joy**;

1 Thes. 1:6 And you became followers of us and of the Lord, having received the word in much affliction, with **joy** of the Holy Spirit,

Rom. 14:17 for the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and **joy** in the Holy Spirit.

Rom. 15:13 Now may the God of hope <u>fill</u> you with all **joy** and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

a. By Means of God's Spoken and Written Revelation

Jn. 15:11 "These things I have spoken to you, that My **joy** may remain in you, and *that* your **joy** may be full.

Jn. 17:13 "But now I come to You, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have My **joy** <u>fulfilled</u> in themselves.

1 Jn. 1:4 And these things we write to you that your joy may be full.
