Evaluating Our Response to God's Light (John 3:16-21)

¹⁶ "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. ¹⁷ "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved. ¹⁸ "He who believes in Him is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. ¹⁹ "And this is the condemnation, that the light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. ²⁰ "For everyone practicing evil hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed. ²¹ "But he who does the truth comes to the light, that his deeds may be clearly seen, that they have been done in God."

GOD'S ACTION: God Gives His Son (John 3:16-18)

1. God's ACTION - What Did God Do? (16a)

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son..."

- a. God took action
- b. God sacrificially cared for the world
- c. God gave His only begotten Son

2. God's INTENTION – Why Did God Do It? (16b-17)

that whoever **believes** in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. ¹⁷ "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved.

God so loved the world that He gave His Son

a. <u>In order that</u> whoever believes might not perish but have everlasting life

God sent His Son into the world

- b. NOT <u>in order that</u> He might condemn the world
- c. BUT in order that He might save the world through Him
- 3. Our DECISION What Must I Do? (18): Only Two Groups

¹⁸ "He who **believes** in Him <u>is not condemned</u>; but he who does not **believe** <u>is condemned already</u>, because he has not **believed** in the name of the only begotten Son of God.

- a. Not "Do" (Nicodemus in John 3:1-8)
- b. BELIEVING on Jesus = Not Presently Condemned (Judged)
- c. NOT BELIEVING on Jesus = Already Condemned (Judged)
- d. Why? Because he has not BELIEVED on Jesus

OUR ACTION: Respond to God's Light (John 3:19-21)

1. Condemnation: Why Are People UNDER JUDGMENT? (19)

¹⁹ "And this is the <u>condemnation</u>, that the light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil.

- a. Revelation: Light has come (\rightarrow) into the world
- b. Rejection: Men LOVED darkness rather than the light
- c. Reason: Because "were being (...) evil their deeds"
- 2. Explanation: Only Two Groups of Deed-Doers

a. Those that are practicing evil deeds

²⁰ "For everyone practicing evil hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed.

- Are hating the light
- Are not coming to the light
- To avoid deed rebuke (2 Tim 4:2; noun: 2 Tim 3:16 "reproof")

b. Those that are doing the truth

²¹ "But he who does the truth comes to the light, that his deeds may be clearly seen, that they have been done in God."

- Are coming to the light
- To have deeds openly evaluated
- To have deeds divinely affirmed
