## Measuring Our Maturity, Part 2 (1 John 2:7-11) – Loving My Brother

<sup>7</sup> Brethren, I write no new commandment to you, but an old commandment which you have had from the beginning. The old commandment is the word which you heard from the beginning. <sup>8</sup> Again, a new commandment I write to you, which thing is true in Him and in you, because the darkness is passing away, and the true light is already shining. <sup>9</sup> He who says he is in the light, and **hates his brother**, is in darkness until now. <sup>10</sup> He who **loves his brother** abides in the light, and there is no cause for stumbling in him. <sup>11</sup> But he who hates his brother is in darkness and walks in darkness, and does not know where he is going, because the darkness has blinded his eyes.

## 1. This Measure Is an Command

<sup>7</sup> Brethren, I write no new commandment to you, but an old commandment which you have had from the beginning. The old commandment is the word which you heard from the beginning.

- a. OLD: I am not writing a new command to you
- b. WHEN: But an old command which you had from [the] beginning
- c. HOW: The old command is the word which you heard...
  - One of <u>two</u> primary Old Testament "love" commands
     Lev. 19:18 'You shall not take vengeance, nor bear any grudge against the children of your people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the LORD."
  - Jesus summarized the entire OT with two commands

**Matt. 22:35-40** Then one of them, a lawyer, asked *Him a question*, testing Him, and saying, <sup>36</sup> "Teacher, which *is* the great commandment in the law?" <sup>37</sup> Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' <sup>38</sup> "This is *the first* and great commandment. <sup>39</sup> "And *the* **second** *is* like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' <sup>40</sup> "On these two commandments hang all the Law and the **Prophets**."

## 2. This Measure Is a Command

<sup>8</sup> Again, a new commandment I write to you, which thing is true in Him and in you, because the darkness is passing away, and the true light is already shining.

- a. NEW: A new command I am writing to you
  - New: As exemplified by Jesus

**John 15:9-13** "As the Father loved Me, I also have loved you; abide in My love. <sup>10</sup> "If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love. <sup>11</sup> "These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and *that* your joy may be full. <sup>12</sup> "This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. <sup>13</sup> "Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends.

- **1 John 3:16** By this we know love, because He laid down His life for us. And we also ought to lay down *our* lives for the brethren.
- New: By being upgraded to a higher level
   John 13:34-35 "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. 35 "By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."
- b. **TRUE**: The command is true in him and in you
  - This love was shown to be true by Jesus (1 John 3:16)
  - This love is shown to be true through Jesus' followers
- c. **EFFECTIVE**: We can see God's truth in action it works!
  - The darkness is passing away
  - The true light is already shining

- a. Measure #1 (Positive): The one loving his brother
  - Truth #1a: **CONSISTENCY** Is abiding / remaining in the light
  - Truth #1b: **SAFETY** And scandal in him not is being
- b. **Measure #2 (Negative):** The one hating his brother
  - Truth #2a: **PRESENCE** Is being in the darkness
  - Truth #2b: **GUIDANCE** Is walking in (by) the darkness
  - Truth #2c: IGNORANCE Lack of knowledge
  - Truth #2d: **BLINDNESS** Darkness has blinded his eyes

Gal. 5:13-26 <sup>13</sup> For you, brethren, have been called to liberty; only do not *use* liberty as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. <sup>14</sup> For all the law is fulfilled in one word, *even* in this: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."
